#### 1. Explain how Allah responds when His servants call on Him.

 $\rightarrow$  Allah says in the Qur'an: "When My servants ask about Me, I am near. I answer the call of the caller when he calls on Me."

This means Allah listens and responds to every sincere Dua. He remembers those who remember Him, and whoever walks towards Him, Allah comes towards them at speed.

#### 2. Write the story of Hazrat Fatimah رضي الله عنها and what the Prophet ﷺ taught her.

→ Hazrat Fatimah had to work very hard and asked the Prophet for a servant. Instead, he taught her and Hazrat Ali رضي الله عنه to recite SubhanAllah 33 times, Alhamdulillah 33 times, and Allahu Akbar 34 times before sleeping. He said this is better than a servant, and Hazrat Ali later said he never missed this Tasbih since the Prophet taught it.

#### 3. Describe the importance of Dua and why we should make it a daily habit.

→ Dua is a way to talk to Allah, especially in times of joy or trouble. Allah loves when His servants call on Him and never leaves them empty-handed. We should make it a habit to pray and ask Allah daily because He is always near, listens, and helps us in every situation.
